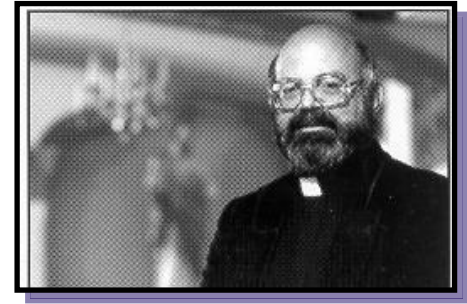
Objectives
